




Carolina Beaded and Cedar Impressions Shingles in desert tan with striking autumn red and forest accents make architectural features come to life with the right balance of texture and color.


CRISP AND EXCITING

Homes with simple designs gain a pleasing complexity when contrasting, but complementary, colors are used. A dark roof paired with walls in a lighter color like marigold adds visual distinction; add dark trim – autumn red, for example – and your home will really pop. Dark siding with bright trim is another approach.
